

Mahoe and rewarewa are occasionally present in canopy. Less common are titoki, karaka, hinau, pukatea, white maire and black maire.																
The understorey consisting of kohekohe saplings and kawakawa is better developed in the eastern end of the reserve.																
Introduced grasses and weeds are present with bracken around the margin of the forest stand within the reserve fence. These weeds include barberry, hemlock, inkweed, ragwort, Himalayan honeysuckle, Scotch thistle, sycamore and tall fescue.

CONCLUSIONS and RECOMMENDATIONS																
A small area of coastal forest with a large number of tree and shrub species although many are represented by only 1 or 2 specimens. The condition of this stand should continue to improve with the increasing development of the understorey and upper understorey layers and improved regeneration of many canopy species.																
A plant of old man's beard and some young sycamore trees should be removed from the south-eastern end of the reserve (See map).
